


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WHO DO YOU SAY HE IS?

You may not have given much thought to who Jesus is or whether his claims have any implications for your life. Who is Jesus? Was he only a popular historical figure? Was he a revolutionary? Was he a prophet? Was he a moral teacher? Was he God? Who did he think he was?

JESUS - TRULY GOD

Jesus is completely God. On several occasions, he equated himself with God and the people of his day accused him of blasphemy. Jesus claimed, "I and the Father are one". The Jews sought to stone him because he a man, was making himself God (John 10:30-33).

When Jesus was worshipped, he accepted that worship (Matthew 14:33; 28:9, 17; John 9:38; 20:28). He also spoke of himself as one who has the power to forgive sins (Mark 2:10-11) and to judge the whole world (Matthew 7:23).

Jesus also performed many miracles. He changed water into wine, walked on water, calmed raging storms, healed the sick, raised a man who had been dead for four days (Matthew 8:24-27; 9:6-7; John 2:1-11; 11:38-44). His control over nature proved he is God.

JESUS - TRULY MAN

Jesus is also man; God and man-both at the same time. Jesus had a human birth (Galatians 4:4-5) and a human body. He experienced growth, hunger, thirst, tiredness, sleep, and death (Luke 2:40, 52, Matthew 4:2; John 19:28; Luke 23:46).

His mind was like ours; he went through a learning process like children do (Luke 2:52). As man, Jesus understands our challenges and he can "sympathize with our weaknesses" because "in every respect has been tempted as we are" (Hebrews 4:15-16; Hebrews 2:18).

Jesus was like us in every respect but one: he was without sin. So, he was qualified to offer a perfect sacrifice for the forgiveness of our sins. He lived a perfect life of obedience which we could not live.

He died and was buried. But he rose from the dead. When some of Jesus' followers visited his tomb two days later, they found the stone rolled away from the tomb. Two men stood by them in dazzling clothing and said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here but has risen" (Luke 24:5-6).

Jesus ascended into heaven, where he reigns over his kingdom, and from where he shall come to judge the world.

Jesus asked his followers: "But who do you say I am?"

Maybe you do not believe Jesus' claims. Well, what is holding you back? Take some time to identify your doubts and seek answers to your questions. Don't put this off! We are happy to assist you on this journey.

Or maybe you're ready to say:

I believe Jesus is the Son of God. I know I'm a sinner and I have rebelled against God and rejected his right as Creator to exercise authority over me. I know I deserve death for that rebellion, and I know Jesus can save me. 99
